Rtn. Salil Bali delivered an interesting, informative, and thought-provoking talk on the Rotary Club Constitution and By-laws. The session was highly interactive, enabling members to gain valuable insights and a clearer understanding of Rotary's governance framework. The Rotary Club Constitution defines the club's fundamental and fixed structure, governing principles, and membership types. It lays down the foundational and mandatory rules, including the club's name, objectives, and purpose, and establishes the high-level framework of the club as an integral part of Rotary International (RI). Being standardized by RI, the Constitution is generally static and cannot be easily amended by individual clubs. In contrast, the By-laws outline the specific operational rules required for the club's day-to-day functioning.



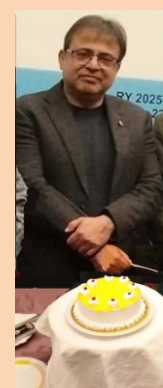

These include meeting schedules, RI and District dues, committee structures, election procedures, and other practical aspects of administration. While By-laws can be amended by the club membership to suit local needs, they must always remain in compliance with the Constitution and the Rotary Code of Policies. The Constitution holds supreme authority, and the By-laws must align with it. Together, these documents are essential - while the Constitution defines what the club is, the By-laws determine how the club operates.

The governing body of a Rotary club is its Board of Directors, which, at a minimum, consists of the President, Immediate Past President, President-Elect, Secretary, and Treasurer. Additional officers may include the Vice President, President-Nominee, Sergeant-at-Arms, or other directors, as decided by the club.

The Rotary Club Constitution mandates that club By-laws specify a clear election process. If a nominating committee is used, the method of its appointment must be detailed. The term of office for a club president is one year; however, if a successor is not elected, the incumbent president's term may be extended for up to one additional year.

PE Bhambra expressed his gratitude to PP Salil Bali for his enlightening session on Rotary Bylaws. The meeting was followed by an enjoyable and a lively fellowship.

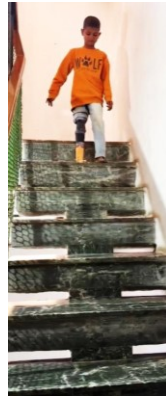
Expressions on the face of the child and her father can't be explained in words.
